

## Heights - Hierarchy of Control for Working at Heights

The Hierarchy of Control is a system that is used to minimize or eliminate risks associated with specific tasks or hazards.

With regard to working at height, the ultimate goal is to ensure a fall from height cannot occur. This can be achieved either by eliminating the need to work above the ground or to provide a solid elevated construction from where the work can be performed. If it is not possible to achieve this, the risk of a fall must be minimized through the application of control measures further down the Hierarchy of Control
