Risk Assessment

What is a Hazard?

A hazard can be seen as anything which has the potential to cause harm to person, processes, and systems.

What is a Risk?

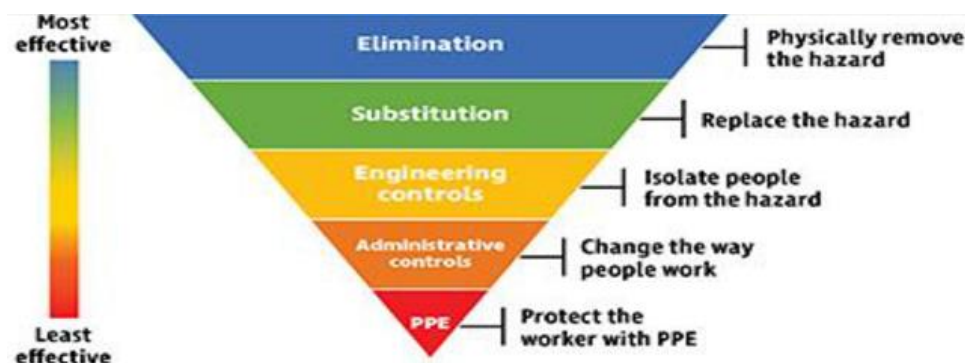
In simple terms, risk is the possibility of something bad happening. Risk involves uncertainty about the effects/implications of an activity with respect to something that human's value, often focusing on negative, undesirable consequences.

What is a Risk Assessment?

Broadly speaking, a risk assessment is the combined effort of: identifying and analyzing potential events that may negatively impact individuals, assets, and/or the environment; and making judgments "on the tolerability of the risk on the basis of a risk analysis" while considering influencing factors. Something that human's value, often focusing on negative, undesirable consequences.

What is Hierarchy of controls?

Hierarchy of hazard control is a system used in industry to minimize or eliminate exposure to hazards.
